


## PORSCHE MOTORSPORT PYRAMID

#### PORSCHE PATHWAY

Porsche has a key focus on young driver development, both in Australia and globally, and through its different tiers of One-Make Series, Customer and Works GT programme provides the perfect pathway for young drivers looking to forge a professional motor racing career. And its success in Australia is evident.

Porsche Cars Australia has developed a proven pathway for young Australian based racers to move through the ranks to a professional racing career. Porsche Michelin Sprint Challenge Australia acts as a strong entry-level racing series where young drivers become accustomed to the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup car before moving to the ultra-competitive Porsche Paynter Dixon Carrera Cup Australia.

Success in Carrera Cup Australia provides the opportunity for drivers to be nominated for the Porsche Motorsport Junior Programme Shootout, which is a multi-day evaluation in Europe which tests the best young racers from each international Carrera Cup series. The winner receives a position as a Porsche Junior and substantial funding towards a seat on the grid of the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, Impress as a Porsche Junior and a driver can become a Porsche Young Professional and compete in Porsche Motorsport's Customer GT racing programmes before progressing to a Porsche Works Driver position and become immersed in Porsche factory racing programme.



# SUCCESSSTORIES

#### INTERNATIONAL CAREERS

Matt Campbell was Australia's initial success story, moving from Sprint Challenge in 2014 to Carrera Cup for the 2015 and 2016 seasons, winning the Championship in only his second attempt, he then claimed victory in the 2016 Porsche Motorsport Junior Programme Shootout. Finishing third in the 2017 Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup promoted Campbell to a Porsche Young Professional in 2018, where he competed in the FIA World Endurance Championship, highlighted by a GTE-Am victory at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, before starting the 2019 season with a sensational outright victory at the 2019 Bathurst 12 Hour.

Campbell was promoted to a full factory Porsche Driver for the 2020 season and continues in that role until today, where he has been successful in the world's biggest endurance races including the Le Mans 24-Hour race. In 2023, Campbell will contest the IMSA series in North America in the new Porsche 963 including the 24 Hours of Daytona, with the support from Dane Cameron (USA), Felipe Nasr (Brazil) and Michael Christensen (Denmark),

Jaxon Evans was the second driver to rise to the top of Australia's Porsche One-Make Series to forge an international career. Racing in Sprint Challenge (2015-2016) and Carrera Cup (2017-2018), the 2018 Carrera Cup champion was successful in the 2018 Junior Programme Shootout and contested the 2019 and 2020 Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup.

Other drivers that have progressed up the Porsche Motorsport Pyramid in recent years via the Australian Junior Programme, include the likes of Nick Foster, Harri Jones, Cameron Hill, Andre Heimgartner, Jordan Love and Dylan O'Keeffe, who have all gone on to succeed at the highest levels of the sport both locally and internationally.

Globally, the progression system boasts tremendous success, with the likes of Earl Bamber and Nick Tandy moving through its ranks to ultimately claim success in the 24 Hours of Le Mans and the FIA World Endurance Championship.





#### **CRITERIA**

To be eligible for To be eligible to qualify as a Porsche Michelin Junior driver in 2023:

Team Managers must submit their respective Junior driver's full name, DOB, brief racing history, contact details, dietary requirements, and emergency contact details for a parent (or guardian if below 18 years of age) to angus.thompson@porsche.com.au before 20 January 2023.

Please note: No other Junior applications for the 2023 season will be accepted after this date.

#### Eligible drivers must:

- Attend and complete the Porsche Junior Training Workshop in Melbourne 16-17 February 2023.
- Be born between 30.11.1999 01.03.2006
- Commit to a full season in either Porsche Paynter Dixon Carrera Cup Australia (8 rounds) or Porsche Michelin Sprint Challenge Australia (6 rounds).
- Grant PCA the right to use their driver image and name in the promotion of the Michelin Junior Programme.
- Commit to attendance at a range of promotional events and activities as requested by PCA.
- Comply with all elements of driver standards and behaviour policy as per the 2023 Series Sporting and Technical Regulations.
- \*Commit to provision of signage positions to Michelin on their Porsche race car on the top and bottom of the
  rear wing, on the top of the front bonnet and inside the car on an agreed position. (Designated areas to be
  supplied by PCA)
- \*Commit to the provision of signage positions to Michelin on the Visor of your driver helmet for the 2023 season. (Designated areas to be supplied by PCA)
- Commit to the provision to PCA of written content (race reports, season updates) upon request.

\*If the above cannot be provided due to existing agreements, then an alternative benefit must be provided as agreed with PCA and Michelin.

Please note: Any driver who elects to compete in any other one-make Carrera Cup Championship or Porsche Sprint Challenge Series globally, prior to the 2023 Junior Champion being crowned on 17 September 2023, these drivers will lose their Junior status within Australia and no longer be eligible as a Michelin Junior driver for the 2023 season.



# TRAINING FOCUS

#### JUNIOR TRAINING

The Junior Training Workshop is an integral part of the Porsche Motorsport Development Programme in Australia. Every year Michelin Junior drivers are invited to attend and receive professional coaching from the country's leading experts.

In 2022, the workshop combined elements of the SASR Selection Course with exciting adventure activities, designed to take the drivers out of their comfort zone and offer a unique and unrivalled opportunity for personal development. Across two days, drivers were assessed and guided by former Special Forces operators and were required to draw upon their courage, resilience and stamina to surmount a series of tough mental and physical challenges. Upon completion, drivers had a sense of confidence that they had enhanced ability to perform optimally under pressure. The techniques are invaluable for drivers in dealing with the duress and pressures in a race car.

Brad Hodge, Matt Campbell, Jaxon Evans, Joshua Rogers and Scott Pye were just some of the top drivers and presenters at the 2020 Michelin Junior Driver Training, which took place via a virtual workshop in 2020 due to the Covid-19 travel restrictions. The workshop centered around mindset, mental preparation, managing their brand, producing social media content, sponsorship, heart intelligence, resilience and coherence.

The 2019 training workshop saw the Juniors receive professional coaching on sports psychology, social media, media training, branding, sponsorship as well as nutrition and dietary advice. Drivers also received nutrition and dietary advice after completing a thorough range of physical assessments.



### BRANDING REQUIREMENTS

#### **BRANDING ASSETS**

Drivers who are part of the Porsche Michelin Junior Programme Australia in both Carrera Cup and Sprint Challenge are required to provide certain branding assets on both their race car and helmet. Only drivers who follow these branding requirements will be eligible to receive Junior Programme benefits in 2023.


All signage will be provided by Porsche Cars Australia. Michelin Juniors can request signage for the start of the season or take delivery of the signage for application at round one of their respective series.

#### RACE CAR - WING AND BONNET SIGNAGE

In addition to the Series Reserved Signage, Michelin Juniors must provide signage assets on both the rear wing (top and bottom side)

#### HELMET- VISOR SIGNAGE

Each Michelin Junior must provide visor signage as provided by Porsche.





## MICHELIN PRIZE POOL

#### RACING FOR PRIZES

Michelin Juniors will race for prizes at each Carrera Cup Australia and Sprint Challenge Australia round. The prize pool sees the top three Junior drivers from each series, receive a set of Michelin competition tyres every round, while the top placed Junior driver at each event will also receive a complimentary entry for the round. The Michelin Junior Champion, which is crowned toward the end of the 2023 Porsche Paynter Dixon Carrera Cup Australia season, will receive a trip to Germany to attend the Porsche Motorsport Night of Champions Dinner in December 2023.



### BECOMING A 2023 MICHELIN JUNIOR

#### JUNIOR PROGRAMME

To become a Michelin Junior in 2023, a driver must meet all entry criteria and provide all branding requirements for the Junior Programme. Michelin Juniors are also required to sign an agreement with Porsche Cars Australia before the start of the driver's respective racing series.
